**REGULATION NO. 2005/27**

**ON THE PROMULGATION OF  
THE LAW ON AN AMENDMENT TO LAW NO. 2003/2 AND 2003/21  
ON PUBLIC FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY  
ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF KOSOVO**

The Special Representative of the Secretary-General,

Pursuant to the authority given to him under United Nations Security Council resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999,

In conformity with sections 8.1, 9.1.44 and 9.1.45 of the Constitutional Framework for Provisional Self-Government in Kosovo (UNMIK Regulation No. 2001/9 of 15 May 2001),

Taking into account a communication from the President of the Assembly of Kosovo, dated 25 February 2005, concerning the Law on an Amendment to Law No. 2003/2 and 2004/21 on Public Financial Management and Accountability adopted by the Assembly of Kosovo on 23 February 2005,

Noting that the provisions of the Law shall be without prejudice to the authority of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General under UNSCR 1244 (1999), or his reserved powers and responsibilities under the Constitutional Framework for Provisional Self-Government in Kosovo and particularly section 8.1 (c) thereof,

Hereby promulgates effective as of the date of signature the Law on an Amendment to Law No. 2003/2 and 2004/21 on Public Financial Management and Accountability (Law No. 02/L-16) attached to the present Regulation, provided that:

(a) The term "Appropriations Law" whenever used in the Law shall be read and interpreted as "Appropriations Legislation", in conformity with paragraphs B(b) and (c) of UNMIK Regulation No. 2003/17 on the Promulgation of a Law adopted by the Assembly of Kosovo on Public Financial Management and Accountability; and

(b) In the chapeau of the amended section 21.1, the term “adopted” shall be replaced by “approved”.

The change in (b) above shall be reflected in the final official text of the Law.
