MONITORING PILLAR

EULEX assesses the functioning of the Kosovo judiciary in terms of **procedural, legal and human rights compliance** through monitoring of selected cases at the entire chain of the **criminal justice** system, i.e. on police, prosecutorial and judicial level.

From 15 June 2018 to 14 June 2021, EULEX's justice monitors attended

including high-profile cases, war crimes cases, gender-based violence cases, hate crimes, corruption cases, and cases previously dealt with by EULEX. This monitoring results in reports with findings and recommendations for the Kosovo authorities aiming at improving the justice system.

EULEX provides technical support to the implementation of the existing agreements of the EU-facilitated Dialogue on normalisation of relations between Belgrade and Pristina.

EULEX supports the Kosovo Correctional Service's efforts to develop a professional senior management team through monitoring, mentoring and advising.
